The Donut Dollies actually had higher standards for joining and being active in the Red Cross than the boys in the military. The Red Cross Supplemental Recreational Activities Overseas (SRAO) initiative set the rules—the girls had to be completely higher-level educated

(college graduates), 21 years or older, and come with several letters of recommendation from prominently recognized U.S. citizens. Higher than average physical exams also had to be passed, along with someone subjectively deciding on whether or not these girls had what was deemed "outstanding personality". Despite their names, they did not serve donuts in Vietnam as that was a WWII gig. Instead, these girls wrote audience participation game shows, put them in a large green bag, and jumped in a chopper, or a jeep or a truck...whatever could take them to the firebases and LZs, where they literally played games with the troops and passed out ditty bags or other goodies sent to them.

WWII veteran W.C. Vest celebrates 100th birthday



PRINCETON — More than 80 years ago, a young man enlisted in the U.S. Navy and soon learned what was like to be bombed every day and wake up with your pup tent full of water. He lived to tell his stories with the children, grandchildren and great-great grandchildren. Vest became a member of the Navy Construction Battalion, also known as the Seabees. "We were bombed every day for the first month," Vest recalled. "We managed to shoot
