

## **Seabee Monument Dedication**

BLOOMFIELD, Mo. -- Seats were put in place for 40 people for the unveiling of a monument honoring the U.S. Navy Seabees at the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery at Bloomfield. Thomas Meyer, a former Seabee from Cape Girardeau, hoped for 50 people to show up for the dedication. Final attendance was closer to 250, with in excess of 80 Seabees in attendance. The monument is part of a much larger mission of the Navy Seabee Veterans of America. They hope to place one such monument in each of the nation's 50 National veteran's cemeteries, as well as in each state veteran's cemetery.

While the organization has met its national goal, the monument erected at Bloomfield is the first placed in a state veteran's cemetery in Missouri. The Southeast Missouri Seabee Chapter Island 5 hosted a district meeting prior to the ceremony in the committal shelter at the cemetery, with those in attendance staying to honor the memory of those for whom this monument was built.

During the service, every former Seabee to stood and identified themselves to the crowd. A total of 83 veterans stood, sharing their name and the years they had served for a full half hour.

Edwin Winters, 92, of Marble Hill, served as a Seabee from 1943-45 in World War II. Asked to participate in the unveiling itself, Winters smiled and said that this was a special day, "It's great to be able to be here for this." Senators Wayne Wallingford (R-27) and Doug Libla also spoke at the event, recognizing those who served the country as Seabees. Wallingford focused on the importance of keeping the story of the Seabees alive for years to come. "We have to make sure that future generations understand the responsibility of military duty and see it as something to work toward--a source of pride," Wallingford said.

He shared a tale of having to explain the Seabees to a young staff member who was not familiar with the Naval Construction Battalion.

"What I found strange is that "Seabee," as a term, is something younger generations aren't familiar with," he said. "There was a time not long ago when youngsters playing with dump trucks or children playing in their back yards dreamed of growing up to be a Seabee." Wallingford said he hopes monuments such as the one erected at Bloomfield can serve to bring back such enthusiasm about military service. Libla also spoke briefly, sharing his thoughts on the importance of reflecting back on the work the Seabees have done for this nation.

"Oftentimes, this brave group of soldiers was first on the scene--charged with clearing obstacles or securing locations and often entered battle before construction could even begin," Libla said. "They answered their country's demand without delay, filling the demand for skilled soldiers needed for public works projects while simultaneously fighting for our freedom." For that reason, Libla stressed that the Seabee memorial is one to which everyone should pay their respects. "Today, we honor those Seabees who gave their lives for us," he said. "They will forever be remembered for their personal sacrifice and the dignity with which they served."

The monument is placed south of the committal shelter, near the flagpoles overlooking the pond that is the centerpiece of the cemetery.
